

### About Annecy International Animated Film Festival 2019

Annecy International Animated Film Festival, the world's largest and most influential film festival dedicated to animation, will take place in Annecy, France from June 10th to 15th. Its top honors have previously been awarded to Hayao Miyazaki and Isao Takahata, and in 2017, its grand prize was won by Masaaki Yuasa for "Lu Over the Wall," while its Jury Award was given to Sunao Katabuchi's "In This Corner of the World."

Annecy is also the longest running animated film festival in the world, and continues to go from strength to strength. Japan has participated continually, via the Japan Media Arts Festival's Overseas Promotion program, and also Anime Tokyo. This year, for the first time in 20 years, Japan has been chosen as Annecy's Tribute Country, an initiative in which the festival focuses on a different nation each year, and introduces its animation culture.

Creators, producers, buyers, and distributors from around the globe gather at Annecy, where the latest trends in Japanese animation will be presented through a collaboration between industry, academia, and government.

#### ▼ About Annecy International Animated Film Festival

The world's largest film festival dedicated to animation, held annually in June in Annecy, France. Officially recognized by ASIFA (International Animated Film Association). Pass holder numbers reached approximately 450 in the 1980s, 5,000 in the 1990s, and exceeded 10,000 in 2017.

- 1965: Festival founded as the successor to an animation event previously held in conjunction with the Cannes International Film Festival.
- 1965-1975: Held biennially, specializing in short films.
- 1985: International animation market MIFA established.
- 1997: Sections created for television animation and commercials.
- 1999: Began to be held annually rather than in alternate years.
- 2017: Japan selected as the festival's inaugural Tribute Country.
- 2017: Number of Pass holders exceeds 10,000.





### About the Japan Media Arts Festival

The Japan Media Arts Festival recognizes excellent works in four categories: art, entertainment, animation, and manga, as well as providing viewing opportunities for award-winning works as a comprehensive festival of media arts. Since it was first held in 1997, it has celebrated media artworks possessing superlative artistic merit and creativity, and held exhibitions and screenings of award-winning works, in addition to symposiums and other events.

For its 22nd edition, 4,384 entries were received from 102 countries and regions. The Japan Media Arts Festival continues to grow into an international event focused on ever-diversifying contemporary artistic expression. Furthermore, the Agency for Cultural Affairs operates a wide range of initiatives to present award-winning works both domestically and internationally, with the aim of promoting creativity in and the development of media arts. Through projects that further media arts in Japan and support creative endeavors, the festival strives to anticipate future trends.

### About the Japan Media Arts Festival's Overseas Promotion outreach
